Youth Library Cards

For children entering Kindergarten and everyone in between up to age 17.



We are unable to assign new cards to your student without a parent or legal guardian present until the age of 16, but we encourage parents and guardians to come to the library and sign your student up to receive a free library card. Your student will also receive a prize courtesy of Lincoln Elementary when they sign up at Warren County Public Library. Many of the free resources provided with this card are eligible for use both inside the classroom and at home. When signing up your student for a card you will need both...

1. photo identification (driver's license or passport)
2. Proof of residency (a piece of mail with your name and address, utility bill, voter registration, bank statement, etc.).

Students 16 and up may acquire a library card on their own without a parent or guardian present as long as they have the above listed items to show.
